Introduction

Our health is affected by where and how we live, work, play and learn. By understanding what needs our community has in these areas can help us build a healthier community. This annual update provides progress on strategies listed in the 2016 Laurel County Community Health Improvement Plan for the first year of implementation.

The 2016 Laurel County CHIP was developed in 2016 by the Laurel County Health in Motion Coalition utilizing key findings from the 2015 Laurel County Community Health Needs Assessment (CHA). The CHA, which serves as the foundation of the CHIP, includes qualitative and quantitative data from local, state and national indicators. This data helped to inform the CHIP health priority areas. The CHIP is an action-oriented strategic plan that outlines community driven goals, objectives, strategies and measures for a three-year period addressing the top four health priority areas.

1. Substance Abuse
2. Chronic Disease Prevention and Management
3. Teen Pregnancy
4. Dental Health

The 2016 CHIP action plan implementation began on July 1st, 2016. Each implementation year of the plan is for the time period of July 1 - June 30.

The Laurel County Health in Motion Coalition serves as the steering committee that develops and implements the CHIP. This coalition is made up of multiple partners and stakeholders who are working on implementing the CHIP's goals, objectives and strategies with a shared aim of making measurable progress in each goal. The membership of this coalition includes: Laurel County Health Department, Saint Joseph London, City of London, London Police Department, Cumberland River Regional Prevention Center, Cumberland Valley Area Development District, Laurel County Agency for Substance Abuse Policy, Laurel County Cooperative Extension Service, Laurel County Schools Family Resource Centers, Cumberland Valley Regional Epidemiologist, Laurel County Community Cooperative Care, Laurel County Rotary Club, Kentucky One VNA Home Health, Tri-County Hospice, Operation UNITE, Kentucky Department for Public Health (Cumberland Valley Regional Preparedness Coordinator), First United Methodist Church and others.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE

BACKGROUND: Substance abuse not only affects the user, it affects the user’s entire network of family and friends. Substance abuse many times leads to criminal activity and criminal charges. Drug overdoses continue to skyrocket across Kentucky and the nation, causing the public health professional to re-think the way addiction is treated. In addition, neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS) has dramatically increased in Kentucky with a 48% increase from 2013-2014⁵.

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CHRONIC DISEASE

BACKGROUND: Kentuckians experience a high burden of chronic diseases compared to the nation overall. Most frequently, the rates of chronic disease prevalence, risk factors, and mortality are highest across eastern Kentucky as compared to the rest of the state. Kentuckians with lower levels of income, those with less than a high school education and African Americans experience higher rates of illness and mortality due to chronic diseases than other groups. Lack of physical activity, poor nutrition, tobacco use, exposure to second hand smoke, and excessive alcohol consumption are all modifiable behavioral risk factors that are associated with common, serious chronic diseases⁸

TEEN PREGNANCY

BACKGROUND: Adolescent pregnancy and parenthood are closely associated with a host of social and economic issues that affect teen parents, their children and society. Teenage mothers are less likely to finish high school and are more likely to live in poverty, depend on public assistance, and be in poor health than slightly older mothers. Their children are more likely to suffer health and cognitive disadvantages, come in contact with child welfare and correctional systems, live in poverty, drop out of high school and become teen parents themselves.⁹

DENTAL HEALTH

BACKGROUND: Dental health is integral to the general health and well-being of all Americans. Dental health complications can devastate overall health and well-being, and financial and social costs that diminish the quality of life. Oral diseases and conditions are associated with other health problems.⁴ Untreated tooth decay, gum disease, and other oral health ailments play a role in chronic conditions such as cardiovascular disease, diabetes, respiratory disease, and cancer.¹
